NASA Astronaut Steve Nagel of Canton was the featured speaker at this year's Chapter Christmas Luncheon. His presentation included an extensive slide show featuring his experiences preparing for and flying missions on the Space Shuttle.

Nagel explained what was involved in training for the space environment. The extent and duration of G forces during

acceleration to orbit and on landing approach. The planning and computerization involved in re-entering the atmosphere and the steep descent down the glide slope to landing.

He also related what it was like to function in a weightless

condition and how long it took for him to regain his land legs after returning to earth.

Steve had many slides of space shuttle hardware, including pictures of the space shuttle panel and instrumentation, the booster rockets and some of the payload projects he flew with that were not classified.

One of the slides was of Steve standing next to a Taylorcraft belonging to his father "Pete", that looked to be about a 1946 model. This is the aircraft he learned to fly in.

Another slide showed Steve at the bottom in the foreground being dwarfed by a space shuttle on the launch pad in the background! Steve said that while this is what he flies now, he is an EAA member and continues to be an avid sport aviation enthusiast.

As with most 'plane' people, Bill's interest in aviation surfaced as a pre-teen, with model airplane building. He started with basic models and quickly progressed thru the gas engine powered U control and free flight types. Bill became an expert at starting the .6 cc Ohlssons & Rice gas engines, they were really hard to start in those days+@#\$(%*^&! He still has the skinned knuckles and fingers from prop strikes to prove it!

In the early 1970's Bill's mild inattention to aviation was SNAPPED back to 'DO IT NOW" when he saw the infamous BD-5 prototype type/literature/advertising produced by Jim Bede. Right then Bill decided that he might REALLY want to build a BIG plane some day. He decided to learn how to fly..."right now."

Bill began flying lessons at Mt. Hawley Airport and received his Private License in 1973. Bill continued to build time and flying experience and received his Commercial rating in 1976. In the mid 70's Mt. Hawley rented out a Cessna 150 Aerobat and a Citabria/Decathlon, in which Bill was exposed to the world of AEROBATICS.

Bill's interest in aerobatics expanded as his abilities grew beyond the basics. In 1980 Bill purchased a Super Decathlon and honed his skills to the point where he was competing in the various U.S. Nationals. Bill has earned trophies in both the "Sportsman" and "Intermediate" categories of aerobatic competition.

Bill has made numerous improvements and updates to his Super Decathlon and keeps himself and his plane 'at the ready' for aerobatics.

Bill is a charter member of EAA Chapter 563. He is active in Chapter functions and has twice served as Chapter President and once as Vice-President.

"BUGGY CARB" Provided by Al Lurie, Chapter Technical Advisor

The NTSB furnished info from an aircraft accident investigation involving a Cessna 152 with a Marvel-Schebler MA-3A, Model 10-5199 carburetor. The pilot experienced a complete loss of power during a climb which resulted in an off-airport landing. There were no injuries; however, the aircraft sustained substantial damage. Evidence prompted suspicion that the carb was the cause of the power loss. When the carb was disassembled, the float valve and seat assembly appeared to be unusually high. A darkened stain was noted in the bottom of the fuel bowl. The fuel discharge nozzle was removed, and a dark round object was seen in the fuel channel at the base of the mixture metering sleeve where fuel pickup occurs for the fuel discharge nozzle. The object was removed, and after an examination under a microscope, it was determined to be the head of an insect approximately .09375 inch in diameter. From the size of the insect head and the dark stain in the bottom of the aluminum fuel bowl, it was believed this debris had been in the fuel bowl since it was last assembled because it could not have passed the inlet screen. The carb functioned properly for approximately 50 hours before the insect decomposed and its head blocked the engine fuel supply.
